






Four plays by graduating MFA directors and designers

___ GRADFEST 2024 is a season of productions directed and designed by this year's graduating MFA students. The four plays being produced are a culmination of an intensive year of hands-on training in theatre directing, lighting design, costume design and set design. The cast of each production consists of final-year acting students and the backstage roles are undertaken by our Stage Management and Technical Theatre students.



"I've been on those pills for so long, I don't know who I am without them, if the things I say or do are because of the medication or in spite of it — but what I do know is that before you put me on them I could write. It is the only thing I know about myself that is true, or real, or in any way authentic"

Diagnosed with a severe mental illness as a child, Anna has been on medication for so long she can't remember who she is without it. All she knows is that, as a little girl, she was a prodigious writing talent, in possession of a thrilling imagination. Has this been lost to years of pills and prescriptions? Now 18, Anna is determined to find out. Walking the line between control and care, her mother Renee, has always been at her side, keeping her safe.

On the precipice of a new chapter, both women struggle to find their place. Will they find a balance where both can thrive or will their delicate ecosystem collapse under these new pressures?

Kendall Feaver's multi-award-winning play is a heartfelt drama filled with humour, pain and a little bit of magic. A play about mothers and daughters, caretakers and finding yourself amongst all the labels.

The Almighty Sometimes was first performed at the Royal Exchange Theatre, Manchester (UK) as a winner of the 2015 Bruntwood Prize for Playwriting on February 9th, 2018, directed by Katy Rudd.

The Nest, by Franz Xaver Kroetz and translated by Conor McPherson is an environmental drama set in Dublin in 2024. Martha and Kurt, expectant parents, reside in a small apartment, work tirelessly, yet their efforts never suffice. When Kurt is offered quick money for a mysterious side job, his decision is swift. The play delves into the interplay between individual choices and collective consequences, exposing the underlying violence within our socioeconomic structure.



Anna Biza was born in Athens and is majoring in Set Design and minoring in Dramaturgy for her MFA in Stage Design at The Lir Academy. She also holds a Diploma in Architecture from the University of Patras, Greece, and has completed a one-year workshop in Set & Costume Design at the National Theatre of Greece in Athens.

Over the last number of years, she has worked as a set designer assistant on several productions in Greece with companies including the Athens & Epidaurus Festival, National Theatre of Greece, Greek Art Theatre Karolos Koun and more. She has also worked as an assistant in production and video design projects for television and theatre, as well as a freelance architect, associate academic researcher, and teaching assistant in the field of architecture and urban design.



Maria Del Mar Parés Baraldés is majoring in Set Design and minoring in Dramaturgy for her MFA in Stage Design at The Lir Academy. Maria graduated from the University of Art and Design of Barcelona in 2023 with a BA in Design, which included experience in interior design, as well as visual arts and the culture of design. During her time there, she cultivated a deep passion for the performative arts, especially when she first encountered scenographic design. As a part of her studies, she was able to train as a set designer with professional scenographers and theatre creators.

As a part of her placement, she worked with set designer Anna Alcubierre in a National Theatre of Catalonia production, as well as the sculptor Jaume Plensa for an exhibition on Barcelona's iconic building, La Pedrera. In both projects she had the role of set design assistant.

Connor Mickiewicz

Connor Mickiewicz graduated from NYU's Tisch School of the Arts with a BFA in Theatre. Originally from California, he was the founding artistic director of New Helvetia Theatre in Sacramento until 2019. Their mission was to produce lesser-known and contemporary musicals. Directing credits include 35MM: A Musical Exhibition, Merrily We Roll Along, Passion, Marry Me a Little, Tell Me On Sunday, and Celebration (NHT). Acting credits include Dean/Devin in Gloria and Baby William in The Behavior of Broadus (Capital Stage), Jeff in [title of show] and Warren in Ordinary Days (NHT), as well as Nick/Narrator for Ron Cunningham's The Great Gatsby (Sacramento Ballet).



Friederike Karpf is a director based in Dublin. She has a background in Political Science, Theatre Studies, and Theatre Pedagogy. Her recent directing credits include Abraumhalde by Elfriede Jelinek (2020), Abgehoben (2021), and Schichten (2022). She is a founding member of the transdisciplinary, international collective projekt.vakuum, whose production Tanken (2023) premiered at the Edinburgh Fringe Festival. Friederike is interested in politically ambitious experimental, writer-led, devised theatre and performance work that strives for socioeconomic change.



Zia Basbaum is a Brazilian theatre-maker with experience in acting, performance art, devising, and theatre directing, amongst other elements of theatrical craft. She has trained professionally as an actor, and has a Bachelor's Degree in Artes Cênicas (Scene Arts) from Universidade de São Paulo (USP). Professionally, she has worked as an assistant director to Cibele Forjaz in two productions: Estação_3: EMBORAR (2022), part of the triptych A Morte da Estrela, by CIA Barca de Dionísos; and Forjaz's staging of the Brazilian Opera, II Guarany (2023), for the Municipal Theatre of São Paulo. She comes from a background of highly political art, marked by joy, sex and viscera. She aims to be disruptive, ritualistic, dream-filled, generous, collective, and absolutely, above all, passionate in her work. In 2023, she was awarded the Haddad Fellowship by the Haddad Foundation, to pursue the Theatre Directing MFA at The Lir Academy of Dramatic Arts.
